Regulations for Outstanding New Student Full Scholarships of the Graduate School of Curriculum and Instructional Communications Technology, National Taipei University of Education

Revised during the 4th meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee in the 104th academic year on December 8, 2015.

Amended and approved during the 5th meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee in the 104th academic year on December 29, 2015.

- 1. These guidelines are established based on the "Guidelines for Outstanding New Student Full Scholarship at National Taipei University of Education."
- 2. Eligible recipients: New students enrolled in the Master's program in Graduate School of Curriculum and Instructional Communications Technology (hereinafter referred to as "the Institute") in the day program (Not applicable to students with full tuition and credit fee waivers or government-sponsored students).
- 3. Number of scholarships: One scholarship.
- 4. Scholarship amount and duration: The scholarship covers the full tuition and credit fees for a maximum of two years. Recipients are not eligible to receive other scholarships offered by the university simultaneously.
- 5.Eligibility criteria: For both the Master's program in Curriculum and Instructional Communication and the Master's program in Educational Communication and Technology, at least two of the following three qualifications must be met in an alternate-year rotation:
 - (1) Ranked among the top 20% of admitted students in the class.
- (2) Admitted to any of the national top universities (according to the list announced by the Ministry of Education) in the fields of education, communication, or technology.
- (3) Demonstrated outstanding performance in education, communication, or technology-related fields (e.g., participation in research projects by the Ministry of Science and Technology for college students, publication of academic papers in international journals, winning international competitions, receiving academic scholarships during undergraduate studies).
- 6.Selection and awarding procedure: The Institute shall review and approve the list of scholarship recipients through the Faculty Review Committee within two weeks after the announcement of the admissions examination results. The list will then be submitted to the Office of Academic Affairs.
- 7. Termination of the scholarship: The scholarship will be terminated if the recipient:
- (1) Applies to retain admission status or takes a leave of absence during the first semester of enrollment.
 - (2) Voluntarily withdraws from the program or leaves the university due to

withdrawal, transfer, or other reasons.

(3) Fails to achieve a ranking within the top 30% of academic performance in the previous semester.

Vacancies resulting from the termination of scholarships will not be filled.

- 8. These guidelines apply to new students admitted to the university from the 105th academic year onwards.
- 9.Matters not covered in these guidelines shall be governed by the university's regulations and relevant laws.
- 10.After approval by the Academic Affairs Committee and the Educational Affairs Committee, these guidelines shall be announced and implemented upon approval by the President.

(1) Top 20% in academic performance upon admission

- (2) Admission to any nationally top-tier universities (according to the list announced by the Ministry of Education) in the current academic year in the fields of education, communication, or technology-related research institutes will be given 10 points.
- (3) Other outstanding performances in the fields of education, communication, or technology-related areas (participation in college student science and technology research projects, publication of academic papers in both Chinese and English journals, international competition awards, and receiving academic scholarships during university studies)."
